# Fund-the-Grants Program

The Center for Applied Nursery Research (CANR) is a non-profit 501(c)(3), founded in 1997, to provide a managed facility and funding for ornamental horticulture research based on grower needs and conducted under commercial growing conditions. The goal of CANR is to generate information to keep growers in Georgia and the Southeast on the forefront of new ornamental plant breeding, evaluation and introduction, as well as, new nursery production techniques.

The grant process at CANR is industry-driven and directly tied to industry input. Members of the Green Industry are invited to visit this work in progress and present questions and needs for research projects every year during our annual needs meeting. The results of our needs meeting are sent out to researchers at universities around the southeast to solicit proposals. An Advisory Council of industry and university representatives review and rank submitted proposals for new research projects and present their findings to the CANR Board of Directors. The Board of Directors then decides on funding for the upcoming year's projects based on available funds. **250 projects from across the Southeast have been funded by CANR** since 1997.

The results of the **research conducted at CANR benefit the entire industry**. All results are published on the CANR website (free to view and download) and are presented at the annual Open House held in conjunction with the Georgia Green Industry Association Tradeshow each January (Wednesday, January 23, 2013).

The Center for Applied Nursery Research (CANR) provides a unique research tool to the horticulture industry in Georgia and the Southeast; however, **CANR** has been limited in its ability to fund the number of grants to the level that is needed.

The Board of Directors has established a fundraising program directed solely to fund these worthy grants. **100% of all donated funds will be used exclusively to fund grants**--no CANR overhead, red tape, administrative percentages... Each donor will receive a report showing what funds were raised and what projects were funded.

With support from you, CANR will fund more important horticultural research for growers in Georgia and the Southeast.

#### **CANR Mission Statement**

The Center for Applied Nursery Research will:

#### **CANR Needs Based Research Focus**

Each year CANR's Advisory panel is asked to participate in focusing our research on truly relevant and current needs for research. These needs are prioritized and submitted to researchers across the region for the grant proposals related to these needs. Over the years, these needs have been focused into four primary categories:

#### **Plant Specific Problems**

Invasive cultivars, natives, abiotic and biotic stresses, new cultivars or any problem related to a specific plant or group of plants would fall into this category. Projects often cover plant breeding, evaluation or screening of cultivars, or selection and development of alternative crops.

#### **Pest Management**

Disease and pest problems are covered in this category, they may be problems specific to a plant, insect, or disease. Projects typically relate to the evaluation of chemical controls, management techniques, development of forecasting for predicting problems, and investigation of specific plant or pest problems

#### **Crop Production**

Aspects related to the growing a plant are covered in this category. Popular project topics address irrigation management, plant growth regulators, nutrition management and alternative growing media.

#### **Economics & Marketing**

This category deals with the economics of producing and marketing a plant. Alternative fuels or energy saving strategies, transportation efficiency, and general economic issues are covered here.
